MASTER'S PROGRAM THROUGH CONCORDIA UNIVERSITY

For those of you looking into a Master's program, Dave O'Donnell, the program director, sent this information to me. This is in no way an endorsement for the program but merely a bit of information if you are interested.

Concordia University's program offerings will include a Master's of Education in the following fields: M.Ed. in Educational Administration, M.Ed. in Literacy w/ ESL Endorsement, M.Ed. in Literacy, and M.Ed. in Early Childhood Education. The program format will include a two-year or less completion time, class one evening per week, and a lengthy summer break.

The Program Highlights:

Entire program conducted in or near your school; one night a week, same night entire program; class only 4 hours per

week, from 5:00 to 9:00 p.m.; no weekend classes; 2 years or less completion time, including breaks; generous summer, Christmas & holiday breaks; finish one course every 7 weeks; course make-up options available if scheduling conflicts occur; no thesis required; transfer credits considered. no GRE or other admission tests required; one course at a time provides manageable workload; courses may be used for Professional Development requirements
