## INSTRUCTIONAL DAY UPDATE

There have been many questions about what the school day will like next year after the school board meeting on Monday. What I know at this point is that the board all agreed to preserve PLC time but that instructional time needed to be added to all three levels. There are two reasons for this. One is that our curriculum has continued to grow over the years however our time to teach the material has not. Reason two is MPS lost about \$7 million dollars this year because we are below the state average for instructional time. We currently have an average of 1,118 hours and the state average is 1,142. Therefore, the student day will most likely look different next year. The district is working on the specifics right now. They are trying to make these changes without changing the teacher day. At this point it appears as though these changes will come at all three levels. The new policy will be presented at the school board meeting on May 2<sup>nd</sup> so as the information continues to

come in, I will continue to keep you updated. If you have any questions about this please do not hesitate to ask. Or, if you would like me to come out to your building and talk to your members about this topic I am more than happy to do so.
