## **High School**

- Put the National Board Certification stipend back in the contract
- PBIS training: Teachers participating will receive \$150 over three days; can't stay in Lincoln; it's mandated that so many people from a building have to attend

### Middle School

• Question about how the TalentEd website is set up; it would be helpful if it were more user friendly.

#### **Elementary School**

- Construction: Black Elk teachers (and others from additional buildings) in the wings that are being renovated are being told by the morning of May 30<sup>th</sup> to clear out classrooms. Construction is supposed to be done on July 31<sup>st</sup>.
- ACP: Programs are moving out of buildings but students are staying and want to be in the regular classroom. Para support will leave with the program, so how are students getting their needs met?
- Tonya: Teachers need to fight for full time counselors to address mental health issues.
- NeSA: A lot of building services are on hold while testing is taking place. Libraries are being closed because that's where testing is taking place; kids are getting SPED services because teachers are testing.
